2. Tuition Assistance

3. Increased capacity

In December 2024 DPA opened a toddler room at our Saint Catherine campus, increasing our capacity from 12 to 24 toddlers. In the fall of 2025 DPA opened a Middle Elementary (3/4) classroom at our Saint Joseph campus.

5. Fundraising









NWEA MAP GROWTH


Divine Providence Academy administers the NWEA MAP test each fall, winter and spring in grades K-8. The MAP evaluates a students academic performance in Math, Reading, Language Usage and Science. The graphs below shows DPA's Spring 2025 scored compared to national norms in Math and Reading.

Staff use the MAP results to identify students' areas of strength and areas to address. This also allows staff to target instruction to small group and individual student goals.



The median student at DPA is achieving at the 63rd percentile in Math. The national average is the 50th percentile

In Achievement, 77% of our students scored at average or above average percentiles in Math.



The median student at DPA is achieving at the 69th percentile in Reading. The national average is the 50th percentile

In achievement, 78% of our students scored at the average or above average percentiles in Reading.

WINGS

As a Catholic community, Divine Providence Academy welcomes all students to receive an individualized education in a nurturing environment centered in God and in service to others.

Welcoming

We welcome students of various ages learning alongside one another for individual and communal success. DPA averaged 15 students in each homeroom for the 2024/2025 school year.

Individualized education

Students independently achieve academic goals, and are paced at their "just right" level.

Students engage in group projects and learning experiences that encompass multiple grades of curriculum standards.

Students self-direct their learning to meet goals and work with a variety of their peers.

Nurturing environment

Students resolve conflict using restorative practices and reconciliation, as they work alongside their peers for the longevity of their school careers.

God centered

Students attend weekly mass, receive a Catechesis of the Good Shepherd for level I, II and III, monthly Theology of the Body lessons, adoration and virtues. Students receive quarterly reconciliation.

Service to others

Students at DPA learn through quarterly service projects, working collaboratively to understand the importance of giving back to others.
